

# 2004 CAD Salary Survey

Our annual salary survey of AUGI members brought a record number of responses. In this article, we break down the salaries, by geographic region, for the four top job functions, and look at age, gender, experience, education, job benefits and more

In November 2004, we invited all AUGI members to take our online salary survey. An unprecedented number responded, and we thank you. The survey comprised 13 questions ranging from those that sought to gather compensa-


tion-related data to others including age, gender, highest education level, company size, and industry. The results from the more than 3,000 responses we received are analyzed herein.




# **Respondents By Geographic Location**






### **Annual Compensation in 2004**




### Job Title/Function




### **Salary Increase in Last 12 Months**




# **Employee Gender**




